REOPENING:

- Governor refers to Washington Post story on Florida and California reopenings possibly causing increased spikes in Coronavirus cases.

- MTA will take steps to protect LIRR passengers: add more cars to trains for distancing, as well as increased cleaning. Steps toward LI opening.

- Reminder: mask is mandatory on public transport.
- NY pro sports leagues can begin training camps in state.
- All veterinarian practices will be able to open on Tuesday.
- Six new Nourish NY distributions are scheduled for LI this week. - <u>COVIDPhilanthropies@exec.ny.gov</u> for foundations to help.

- Eric Schmidt (former CEO Google) will lead blue ribbon commission on Building Back Better initiative.

- Governor states that government must lead the way in rebuilding / recreating the economy.

- Governor discussed rekindling the ambition behind large-scale projects, mentioning the Robert Moses project, Jones Beach, today's location.
