Louis S. Snitkoff, MD, FACP
President, NYACP



NYACP is excited to announce that Dr. Louis Snitkoff was elected President of the New York Chapter of ACP in April.

A native of Brooklyn, NY, Dr. Snitkoff is a graduate of Union College in Schenectady, and the SUNY Downstate College of Medicine. Dr. Snitkoff completed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine at Albany Medical Center, where he also served as Chief Medical Resident. After residency, Dr. Snitkoff entered the private practice of Internal Medicine in Schenectady. In 1998, he became a founding member of CapitalCare Medical Group, which merged with Community Care Physicians in 2018. Dr. Snitkoff served as its Chief Medical Officer.

In February, Dr. Snitkoff was named Vice President for the Ellis (Hospital) Medical Group in Schenectady. In this role, he oversees inpatient and outpatient services, including primary care, endocrinology, hospital medicine, neurology, infectious diseases, surgery, obstetrics and gynecology, and mental health.

Dr. Snitkoff is a member and past Chairman of the Board of Directors of Hixny, the Regional Health Information Organization for Northeastern New York, and a member of the Healthcare MBA Advisory Council of Clarkson University's Capital Region Campus. Dr. Snitkoff also served as Internal Medicine Coordinator for the St. Clare's Family Medicine Residency program in Schenectady from 1983-2006.

Dr. Snitkoff is Governor of the NYACP's Hudson Valley Region. In 2013 he received ACP's Samuel Eichold II Award for excellence in diabetes, he is a member of the College's Task Force for Physician Wellbeing and Professional Satisfaction, and serves on the Medical Practice and Quality Committee. Dr. Snitkoff was elected as a Fellow of the College in 1993 and received a Chapter Laureate Award in 2013.

In his spare time, Dr. Snitkoff is an avid and accomplished photographer. He and his wife, Gail, live in Albany and have two grown sons and two adorable standard poodles.
