In response to the U.S. Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade last month, <u>NYACP released a statement</u>.

Also, ACP has prepared and released an <u>informational toolkit to assist physician & student members</u> in navigating issues surrounding abortion rights and related policies in their respective states.

The <u>Annual 2021-22 report</u> by ACP's Executive Vice President and CEO **Dr. Darilyn Moyer** is available now, which highlights ACP news and activities over the past year, working with and for you, and on behalf of internal medicine. ACP made significant progress on four strategic initiatives: Valued Professional Identity, Membership Growth & Engagement, Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, and Innovation & Strategic Alignment that help support internal medicine physicians and advance the profession of internal medicine.

NYACP was recently awarded the "2021-22 Chapter Excellence Award – Gold Status" by ACP and received two ACP John Tooker Evergreen Awards (*Ready 2 Rank and Small Feedings of the Soul*). Last week, the Chapter released the following short videos to ACP: Ready 2 Rank & Small Feedings of the Soul.

As you may know or may not know, ACP's Internal Medicine Interest Group (IMIG) Sponsorship Program provides funding and resources to IMIGs to support their interest, meetings, and activities related to Internal Medicine. The Chapter has reached out to all of the 18 medical schools in NYS to promote this opportunity and provide assistance to their respective staff for program participation.

The COVID-19 infection continues to remain a public health crisis globally. Last week, in NYS – the cases per 100K were 34.47 and the 7-Day Average Cases Per 100k were 27.76. (Note: Due to the test reporting policy change by the federal Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and several

other factors, the most reliable metric to measure virus impact on a community is the case per 100,000 data - not percent positivity). We should continue to monitor the data closely, encourage vaccine administration (including boosters), and promote hygiene as per CDC guidelines.

This month, please join me in promoting awareness of Eye Injury Prevention, campaigning, and recognizing July 28 as World Hepatitis Day.


