Covid Booster and Approval by FDA of Covid Vaccine

The FDA and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have recommended a third dose of both the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines for some immunocompromised people. Ongoing research

by Moderna and Pfizer has investigated the effects on immunity from a third dose of either vaccine. Similarly, Johnson & Johnson issued a press release on August 25th with preliminary results of a small study suggesting a second shot of its vaccine could rapidly increase antibody levels in recipients. This news comes amidst the recent FDA approval of the first COVID-19 vaccine.

Records show that in 1882, Peter J. McGuire, a co-founder of the American Federation of Labor, suggested setting aside a day for a "general holiday for the laboring classes" to honor those "who from rude nature have delved and carved all the grandeur we behold." Ultimately, through his efforts and that of many others, Congress passed a bill recognizing the

first Monday of September as Labor Day and making it an official <u>federal holiday</u>. President Grover Cleveland signed the bill into law on June 28, 1894.

I hope everyone has a restful and rejuvenating Labor Day.
