ADVOCACY

Physicians From Across the State Gather in Albany to Advocate on Behalf of Patients and the Profession

The New York Chapter's annual Legislative Day was held on Monday, May 6, 2013 in Albany.

Members were briefed on the status of current health legislation and met with key officials from the New York State Department of Health, local legislators and health policy staff to advocate on behalf of their patients and the profession.

Advocacy efforts were focused on:

- 1) Creating awareness of training and educational requirements for physician Board Certification, recertification or credentialing and the impact of proposed additional education and training mandates;
 - 2) The need for a comprehensive strategy to address physician workforce shortages and suggestions for expanded investments to assure an adequate supply of physicians in all communities;
 - 3) Concerns with proposals to create new "Limited Service Clinics," disruption to longitudinal care and the importance of well defined, team-based care relationships that enhance care.
- The Chapter's legislative priorities seek to expand access to care, enhance efforts toward patient safety and quality of care and increase awareness around public health initiatives.

Earn Financial Support and Receive Technical Assistance As You Achieve Diabetes Recognition

If you are a solo practitioner or are in a small practice that sees patients between 18 and 75 years of age, you may be eligible to receive:

- A \$1,000 incentive upon completion of diabetes recognition
- Continuing technical assistance from the NYACP
- Have the costs for National Committee for Quality Alliance (NCQA) workbook and application fees underwrote by the Chapter.

This is a unique and limited opportunity for eligible solo or small practices who seek to achieve Diabetes Recognition. There are only 7 openings available.
